Submissions may relate to any area of clinical practice which results in improvement to patients' pain management.

Nominees should be proposed and seconded by members of the UKCPA. Nominations should detail the nominee's name and the reasons for the nomination in no more than 500 words. Nominees do not need to be members of the Association. The UKCPA is keen to reward achievements in developing and promoting clinical pharmacy, innovation, research and development, publication and dissemination of good practice, and recognition by peers. As this is a Lifetime Achievement Award, achievements should be over a period of time. The winner will be asked to give a brief acceptance speech. This award may not necessarily be given each year.

First DataBank Europe Information Technology Award – Joint GHP/UKCPA Award Mailed to members September 2010 Closing date for submissions 31 st December 2010	As an oral presentation at the GHP/UKCPA annual IT Group Conference 2011	Value of Award £2500 This award is being offered to identify, recognise and promote 'best practice' in the use of IT to improve pharmaceutical services in a recently completed project. Projects eligible for the award will have been implemented in the past 18 months. Entries should demonstrate how working practices have been improved through the application of IT and must clearly illustrate how this is making a difference to the provision of pharmacy services. Projects that demonstrate benefits to patients or staff will be considered most favourably by the adjudication panel. Topics may be related to patient care, clinical services, medicines management, decision support, electronic prescribing, or any other IT application that improves pharmacy services.
